Letter from the Pastor

Lent is a time of self-denial and sacrifice. These are not words we like to hear. We live in a culture that tells us it's all about you. Eat, drink and be merry for you only live once. Accumulate all you can because the more you have the happier you will be. We can achieve many things in this life and still be empty inside our hearts. We can accumulate great wealth and still find ourselves without a real purpose or meaning in our lives.

Jesus was born into this world. He was one of us. Jesus spent time in the wilderness fasting and praying. He also went to weddings and other parties where there was a great deal of worldly consumption of food and drink. Places where people were making merry and spending a great deal of money on lavish events.
